He wrote the requirements hoping that each chapter, led by an organized Master Councilor, would qualify for this prestigious award.



The award and jewel are given to the Master Councilor, but only by the efforts of the chapter. The chapter members must work with the councilors to succeed in having a good, well rounded term.

Being recognized as a PMC-MSA is an honor that any DeMolay is proud to receive. Every Master Councilor and chapter should strive to earn this coveted award.

HOW TO QUALIFY:

Step One:

3-6 months before Master Councilor Election

- Learn the Master Councilor portion of the ritual
- Create and print a term plan with the help of your advisors and chapter councilors.

Step Two:

Within 10 Days of your Installation:

 Write a first letter of intent to the Executive Officer explaining that you intend to qualify for the award. Include a copy of your term plan.

Step Three:

During your term as Master Councilor

- · Hold Ceremonies of Induction
- Hold an event in each of these areas:
 Civic, Social, Masonic Service, Athletic, and Fund-raising.
- · Initiate six new members.
- · Observe all Obligatory Days in your term.
- · Perform Ritual from memory.
- See that all Form 10's are submitted within the ten day requirement.
- Establish a program that maintains or increases attendance during the term.
- · Show the Youth Protection video.

Step Four:

Within 10 Days of Outgoing Installation:

 Write a second letter to the E.O. outlining how you accomplished each of these requirements signed by your advisor.

Obligatory Days

- 1. Devotional Day
- Sunday nearest March 18 where members of a Chapter attend a church as a group.
- 2. Patriot's Day
- A day convenient to the Chapter in February to honor great patriots and patriotic events of our country.
- 3. DeMolay Day of Comfort
- A day convenient to the Chapter near Thanksgiving or Christmas to assist those in need.
- 4. Educational Day
- A day convenient to the Chapter in September to emphasize the value of an education.
- 5. Parent's Day
- A day between May 1st and June 21st for the Chapter to have a special meeting or observance to recognize parents.
- 6. My Government Day
- A day convenient to the Chapter in the month of July whose purpose is to aid members in understanding our government.
- 7. Frank S. Land Day
- A day convenient to the Chapter near November 8th to observe the memory of and pay tribute to Frank S. Land, the Founder of the Order of DeMolay.
